UNIT REQUIREMENTS

The "UC & Transfer Work Undergraduate Total" on your unofficial transcript represents the preliminary number of units you have completed. However, please note that some units may not apply to the degree and must therefore be subtracted:

- Credit is normally allowed only once for specific course material. Therefore, if you have completed a course at UCSB that duplicates credit already awarded from another institution, or if you have completed mutually exclusive courses at UCSB, credit will be deducted for the duplicate work. Similarly, credit will be deducted for any UCSB course you repeat unless it is designated as repeatable for credit.
- No more than 6 units of ES 1- or equivalent course work will be accepted toward your overall unit requirement.
